- 3. Once everything is in place, reprogramming of existing radios will occur. This is a vital step in order to get the project rolling.

# **NEW CAD SYSTEMS BEING EXPLORED**

We are actively looking at new CAD vendors this month. We hope to have everything narrowed down in the very near future and would like to choose a vendor by the beginning of 2024. Many of you have reached out with ideas and things that you'd like to see in the future from our CAD system. We are presenting those things to each vendor as they demo their product. Many of those things include mobile data terminals, mobile mapping, the ability to see other units assigned to your call, body cam tagging to CAD calls, "silent" dispatching, better reporting capabilities, moving away from faxed times and call records, and on and on.
