RADIO REPAIR, INSTALL, REPLACEMENT AND REMOVAL

Any time a radio, owned by Belmont County 9-1-1, is in need of repair, install, replacement or removal from a vehicle, do not attempt to schedule this on your own. All that needs done is to contact Bryan Minder, Jim Delman or Tony Gregor at (740) 695-9104. We will arrange everything with Bearcom. The work must be approved by us, in order to have the cost covered by us. We will have Bearcom follow up with you to schedule a date and time for the work to be done.

Also, please do not wait until the last minute to have a removal done. We need a minimum of one week notice to get someone out to do a proper radio removal. Removals do not just mean that a radio head is taken out. It also requires that all cables, wiring, antenna, and speaker be removed. Do not do this yourself. We will pay to have it done properly.

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OHIO BURN BAN IN EFFECT

Just a reminder to all, burning is prohibited in Ohio from 6:00 a.m. through 6:00 p.m. for the months of March, April, May, October and November. Burning rules are governed by the ODNR Division of Forestry (ORC 1503.18) and the Ohio EPA (OAC 3745.19).

BELMONT COUNTY RADIO SYSTEM UPGRADES

Movement on the upgrades has been a bit slow, due to weather and order delays. But, over the past few months, crews were able to install the lines, dishes and equipment for the new microwave system at all tower sites. Additionally, they removed all of the old equipment. Upgraded Paging equipment is now in place and is ready to cutover to the new system. Coordination of this is tricky, as parts of the system must be taken out of service to move over. When this occurs, there will be some minor interruptions in paging service. We will work to keep this to a minimum and will be sure to communicate this to everyone effected, before it occurs. Radio and Active 911 will be used as a back-up during these periods.

Next, we will begin to coordinate reprogramming of all mobiles and portables. Every radio in service today will need to be reprogrammed. We will work with each department to get this done in a timely manner.
