2021 CALL NUMBERS

2021 turned out to be a very busy year countywide. From the 9-1-1 side of things, total 9-1-1 calls (32,681) were up by about 8% over 2020 numbers. 7-Digit calls (66,369) were down by about 1% versus 2020. CAD transactions (49,542), or calls for service, were up by 2,467 over 2020, which is a 5% increase. While numbers increased, the average ring time for 9-1-1 calls remained low, at 3.1 seconds.

Total calls for law, fire and EMS agencies (47,251) reflect an increase of 2,705 calls over 2020 numbers. In speaking with a few first responder agencies, some had their busiest year on record in 2021. All countywide numbers are listed on the attached spreadsheets.

BELMONT COUNTY RADIO SYSTEM UPGRADES

Radio flashing is well underway and almost all agencies have had one visit to get their radios reprogrammed and updated. There are many that are complete, but many others still have a few radios to get done, for one reason or another. Some needed a different flash ordered and some didn't have some radios present during the reprogramming.

This flash software will give the radios an update and potential new capabilities. One of those is called Push-to-Talk GPS. When a radio is keyed up, their location will display onto a map at Central Dispatch. This upgrade is not completed on our end yet but will be in the near future. We must purchase the mapping interface, in order to display the radios. Additionally, we still have to verify proper antennas on all portables and mobiles. Once everything is in place, we will be sure to let everyone know of the new feature.

DISPATCHER HOLIDAY GIVING

For the second year in a row, the dispatchers at 9-1-1 decided to forgo their annual Christmas gift cards and instead take that money and donate it to local children in need. This year they were able to pick five names from the Giving Tree at the mall and purchase over \$100 worth of items for each child. With the remaining money, they decided to purchase over \$500 worth of toys for the Operation Toy Life, sponsored by the Belmont County Sheriff's Office and Wheeling Police Department. I am very proud of these dispatchers for their selflessness and generosity to help those in our community during the holidays, and all year long.

RADIO UPGRADE LEVY PASSES WITH FLYING COLORS

We want to thank the voters of Belmont County for supporting our levy, once again. The vote was 7,771 FOR and 4,508 against, for a 63% approval. This levy is vital to our efforts to keep our public safety radio system up-to-date and operating properly, keeping reliable radios in the hands of the first responders and allowing us the funds to continue to upgrade the system and allow for NextGen 911 upgrades. None of this would be possible without the support of the general public and first responders like you. This will help to secure five more years of improvements to the system.

CORONER NOTIFICATION UPDATE

When requesting the Coroner's Office for any reason, please notify Central Dispatch by phone or radio. The dispatchers will then notify their office. Their two investigators, along with Dr. Fisher, have a rotation schedule of who is on call for each day/night. The on-call schedule is known at Central Dispatch and updated by their office. Do not call the Investigators (or Coroner) direct. Next, until direction is given by the Coroner's Office, please be sure to secure the scene from any unauthorized individuals. Last, the Coroner will need the following information when they call: Name, date of birth, time of death, family doctor, medical history, circumstances surrounding the death, law enforcement on scene, funeral home requested and next of kin. Your cooperation is appreciated.

BELMONT COUNTY CISM IS ALWAYS AVAILABLE

Just a reminder to all departments, Belmont County has access to Critical Incident Stress Management teams to help your members 24/7. CISM can be accessed by calling the EMA at 740-695-5984 or by calling into dispatch at 740-699-0425 to request it. All requests are kept confidential.
